CROYDON LODGE OF FREEDOM

The Beginning

The word 'Freedom' in our name is synonymous with the era during the Second World War when the Lodge was formed and Consecrated. At that time freedom was a concept of world significance, deeply rooted in human nature, and the Union flag and the flaming torch, used in the Lodge logo, encapsulated the national focus on remaining a free and unoccupied democracy.

Founding a Lodge called Freedom at that time was a means by which the founders could demonstrate noble qualities and the finest of aspirations. Two of the founders were members of Old England Lodge, No. 1790, which was consecrated in 1879, and is still in existence, so that Lodge is a 'Mother Lodge' of Freedom's.

The Founders and the First Meeting


There were 25 Founder Members and the Lodge was consecrated on Wednesday, 9th June, 1943, at Freemasons' Hall, London, with the Ceremony being performed by R.W.Bro. Lieutenant-Colonel H.A. Mann, *OBE*, *MC*, Provincial Grand Master, assisted by W.Bro. Sir Robert Evans **PGD**, Deputy Provincial Grand Master. The date on the Warrant from Grand Lodge is the 23rd April, 1943.

At that time the membership consisted of 10 shopkeepers (hence the reason for choice of a Wednesday afternoon for the meeting day, as shops then closed for the afternoon), 3 publicans, one Royal Navy Petty Officer, and various other professionals and tradesmen. The Founders' Fee was 10 guineas, the Annual Subscription 3 guineas, and the Joining Fee 5 guineas. There were 134 visitors present at the Consecration and every one used a fountain pen to sign the register!

It is recorded that the first set of "equipment" for the Lodge cost the princely sum of \pounds ,232.10.0 (\pounds ,232.50).

The first meeting took place on Thursday, 8th July 1943, at 5.00 p.m. at the Café Royal, North End, Croydon, and there were 17 Officers, 2 Past Masters, 12 Members and 39 Visitors attending.

At this July 1943 meeting, 2 new Masons were initiated, and a further five 5 joined from other Lodges.



The Temple at The Café Royal, North End Road, Croydon


The Following Years

By the end of 1943, the Lodge had 32 members and within a year this had risen to 40 members.

Probably the most famous member was Thomas Roy "Tommy" Powell, who joined in 1947, and was a florist by trade, but also the Official Timekeeper for the British Boxing Board of Control. He officiated at all major boxing matches.

The Lodge Banner was dedicated on the 5th July 1950, and the Dedicating Officer was, again, R.W.Bro. Lieutenant-Colonel H.A. Mann, Provincial Grand Master.

On the 16th July 1955, the Lodge meeting place was moved to the Masonic Hall, Oakfield Road, Croydon.

On the 26th April 1978, the first set of typewritten minutes appeared in the Minute Book.

On the 26th September 1979, it was proposed that the May meeting of the Lodge be moved to the third Wednesday in November.

Prior to meeting for Lodge of Instruction at the Croydon Masonic Hall, the Lodge met at the Railway Bell Pub at West Croydon.

In 1981, the Almoner at that time adopted the dual role of Charity Steward. This was subsequently split into two roles in 1984.

On the 22nd September, 1993, the Lodge celebrated its Golden Jubilee, 50 years since inauguration, and W.Bro. Clive Hennessy, as Chaplain, read the Oration, given by the Consecrating Chaplain at the original ceremony. The meeting was followed by a six-course Festive Board.

In 1994, the Lodge opened a Charity Relief Chest.

On the 22nd April, 2009, it was announced that Bro. Rumel Rahman had been awarded the Provincial Grand Master's Master Mason Award of the year.

In June 2011, W.Bro. Bob Ord received the Provincial Grand Master's Certificate of Achievement.

On the 25th January, 2012, Honorary Membership was conferred on R.W. Bro. Eric Stuart-Bamford, Provincial Grand Master.

On the 20th November, 2013, W.Bro. David K. Else, Assistant Provincial Grand Master, presented a 50th Anniversary Certificate to W.Bro. David Dawson, PPJGW, who had been initiated into the Lodge on the 25th September 1963.

On the 22nd January, 2014, W.Bro. Chris Wheeler presented a 50th Anniversary Certificate to W.Bro. Jack Proud, PPJGW, who had been initiated into Greenwood Lodge, No.1982, on the 7th March, 1964.




The Wheeler Temple, Croydon Masonic Hall


What was happening in 1943?

January 1. The Japanese begin to withdraw from Guadalcanal. 13. The government says only standard grey or blue school uniforms will be allowed to save on dye. 15. Four IRA prisoners escaped from the Crumlin Road prison. 21. Thirty-eight schoolchildren and eight teachers die when a bomb destroyed the Catford School for Girls in South-east London. 24. The English 8th Army crosses the border into Tunisia in pursuit of the retreating Germans. 30. Berlin is bombed twice daily in the RAF's first daylight raid. February 6. A Los Angeles court acquitted Errol Flynn on three rape charges. 8. The last pocket of resistance is broken by the Russian army at Stalingrad. 19. The Germans seize Dutch works of art for Hitler's gallery in Linz, Austria. 23. A Commons committee recommends equal pay war compensation payments for men and women. March 1. Mahatma Gandhi ends his fast. 7. The 'Wings for Victory' savings campaign starts. 10. Unrest breaks out over forced labour conscription for Germany. 26. In France, the Germans arrest all Britons in Vichy, fearing an Allied invasion. 30. Russian composer Sergei Rachmaninov dies. April 7. In Salzburg, Hitler and Mussolini concluded 4 days of talks on North Africa. 9. The government says it will introduce a unified "national health service". 20. Prime Minister, Winston Churchill says, "We have reached the conclusion that existing orders can now be relaxed and church bells can be rung out on Sundays and Gandhi other special days". May 5. Moscow: Stalin states his desire for a strong, free, Poland. 13. A State of Emergency is declared in southern Italy amid fears of an Allied invasion. 17. Walls of water swept down the Ruhr and Eder valleys in Germany after a raid by RAF 'dambusters'. 19. Churchill makes an historic address to a joint session of the US Congress. June 1. De Gaulle insists on the dismissal of all officials who have collaborated with the Vichy regime. 7. Italian troops start to withdraw from Albania. 3. British actor Leslie Howard is one of 13 passengers missing on a civil aircraft shot down by the

Avro Lancaster bomber that took part in the 'Dambusters' raid Germans in the Bay of Biscay. 25. The King returns from his visit to Allied Forces in North Africa. 30. The government says signposts can be ereced in rural areas. July 10. The first Allied troops enter Sicily.
14. In New York, Gary Cooper and Ingrid Bergman open in the film *For Whom the Bell Tolls.* 24. The city of Hamburg is raided twice in 24 hours. 28. The Italian Fascist Party is abolished.
August 1. The US Air Force bombs Axis oil installations. 13. The Allies bomb Rome, Turin

and Milan. **25.** The Allies name Lord Louis Mountbatten as Supreme Commander in South-East Asia. **September 2.** It is reported that concentration camp inmates are being used for medical experiments by the Germans. **14.** Partisans are advancing along the Dalmatian coast under General Tito. **20.** London: Chancellor of the Exchequer Sir Kingsley Wood dies after a cabinet meeting. **30.** The Allies enter Naples. **October 1.** U-Boats have re-entered the Atlantic and have sunk several ships. **11.** The Royal Navy torpedoes the battleship *Turpitz* in a midget submarine. **19.** In Sweden, 4,200 British PoWs are exchanged for Germans in the first major exchange of the war. **20.** Promiscuity and moral laxity were strongly condemned by the Archbishop of Canterbury and York, following a frightening rise of veneral disease since the start of the war. **30.** Allies held up at Monte

Cassino. **31.** Troops take over from striking dockers. **November 2.** The Chancellor says that PAYE will apply to all wage earners. **6.** Kiev falls to the Russians. **9.** Churchill tells MPs that 60 U-boats have been destroyed in the last 3 months. **15.** RAF Wellington bombers are reported to be using new precision instruments for night-time bombing. **28.** Churchill, Roosevelt and Stalin meet in Tehran. **December 5** Tito announces the creation of a provisional government. **10.** Roosevelt visits the island of Malta and pays tribute to its inhabitants. **7.** "Bevin Boys" are called up to work down the mines. **22.** The government says that there are only enough turkeys for one family in ten.
